| <p>Highlighting</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use electronic highlights on text as needed to recall and/or emphasize. The student has the option to remove highlighting over text. The highlighter color option will change depending on the color contrast option selected. | <p>Highlighters</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Highlight and extract text from any Google document or webpage. Available colors include yellow, blue, green, and pink. Collect highlights by color or position in the original document and export them into a Google document. |
| <p>Answer/General Masking</p> <p>Line Reader</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Enable answer masking for multiple choice and multiple select answers to be masked. Select "Show Line Reader Mask" in the user drop-down menu. The student uses an on-screen tool to assist in reading by raising and lowering the tool for each line of text on-screen. | <p>Screen Masking</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tint the screen, like an overlay, with a reading light line which can be moved up and down the screen using your mouse. This can assist with masking for both answer masking and line reading. |
| <p>Text to Speech (Math)</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select the "Text-to-Speech Player" icon on the toolbar. The test is read aloud to the student using embedded text-to-speech software. The student may pause and resume the audio. | <p>Text to Speech</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read text aloud with dual color highlighting using natural sounding male and female voices. International voices are available for speech-enabling other languages. |

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| Pop Up Glossary | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> View definitions of pre-selected, underlined words by hovering over them. The definition appears in a pop-up text box. | Talking Dictionary | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> View definitions and sample sentences of any word. Definitions can be read aloud. |
| Spell Check | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use the embedded spell check icon to review written text for errors | Check It | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A proofreading tool that checks for spelling Errors, and for grammar, punctuation, capitalization and confusable word errors. |

| Word Prediction on ELA/ Literacy Assessment | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use an external word prediction device that provides a bank of frequently or recently used words, as a result of the student entering the first few letters of a word. | Word Prediction | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide word choices to complete the word students are typing or predict the word they may use next. |
| Speech-to-Text on ELA/ Literacy and Mathematics Response Options | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use an external speech to text device to dictate responses. | Talk & Type | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allow students to dictate their responses into a microphone without having to type. Requires no advanced training. |
| Word-to-Word Dictionary (English/Native Language) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use a pre-approved, word-to-word paper dictionary in their native language, along with extended time in which to use it. | Translator | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allow single words to be translated into 50+ languages. Translations can be speech-enabled. |

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
